Natural History Museum

The Natural History Museum is a newly renovated, modern information center about nature and its beauty all over the world. The oldest exhibit of the museum, which is still an attraction for visitors, is a real crocodile from the Nile that was mounted and stuffed in 1623.

Historical & Ethnological

Sitterwerk

This is a lively center dedicated to art and art-production. It boasts an art library of over 25'000 pieces and a diverse material archive with art production samples. The «Kesselhaus Josephsohn». a hoiler house that is now home to a permanent exhibition and storage area for the sculptures and plasterworks of the sculptor Hans Josephsohn, is open to the public. The «Kunstgiesserei», the photo lab and the institutions of the Sitterwerk contain production, research. conservation, presentation, and mediation of art and therefore interfuse and enrich one another in a multifaceted manner.


Casino

«St. Galler Spitzen» has always been a sought after raw material for expensive haute couture creations and count among the most famous textiles in the world. All the big fashion designers at one point or another come to St. Gallen to accessorise their lace and embroidery creations. Big names such as Akris, Chanel, Armani, Givenchy, Dior, Lacroix and Yves Saint Laurent all create designs with embroidered fabrics made in St. Gallen.

In the 15th century, St. Gallen became known for producing high quality textiles. In 1714, the zenith was reached with a vearly production of 38'000 pieces of fabric. At the beginning of the 19th century, the first embroidery machines were developed in St. Gallen, Around 1910, St. Gallen its embroidery production was the largest export branch of the Swiss economy. More than 50% of the world production came from St. Gallen, However, World War I and the Great Depression caused another severe crisis for St. Gallen textile industry. Nowadays, because of competition and the prevalence of computer-operated embroidery machines, only a reduced textile industry has survived:

Akris

Akris was founded in 1922 by Alice Kriemler-Schoch, an ambitious and entrepreneurial woman who began making polka dot aprons out of her modest sewing studio. Today, Akris is a Swiss fashion house specialising in luxury goods for women: Akris fashion is very modern, with effects that are often based on geometrics or graphic design. akris.ch

Textile Museum

Founded in 1878, the Textile Museum of St. Gallen houses one of Switzerland's most important textile collections housing woven materials and embroideries from every corner of the globe. The building has been the home of the textile museum and the textile library ever since 1886.

Thousands of pattern books, designs, fashion photographs, magnificent textiles and the demonstrations of a hand embroidery machines take visitors into a world of creativity and technological advancements. The library provides an insight into thousands of patterns created by textile designers in the last 170 years.

Walks & Trails

You can do some interesting walks in St. Gallen. Here are some of them:

- Foxtrail (~2h)
 - Exploring the city in an adventurous way. Choose one from several options. Website: foxtrail.ch
- Geocaching
 - There are millions of geocaches hidden around the world there are probably some near you right now. Website: geocaching.com
- Textile walk (~1h)
 If you are interested in the story of embroidery, this is the right walk for you. App: «TextileStGallen»
- Reformation walk (~1h)
 If you are interested in history, you can do the reformation walk.
 App: «R-City Guide»
- Planetary trail (~4h)
 - It starts with the sun at the entrance of the botanical garden and ends almost at the Lake Constance with pluto. You will find the walking map by the sun at the botanical garden.
- The Way of St. James
 - Walk a small part of the popular way. The Pilgrim's Route ends by the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela in Spain. Website: jakobsweg.ch
- Wenigerweiher (Philosophentalweg)
 Just google some pictures and you'll
 see, that this is one of the most
 beautiful small lakes near the city.
- Bridge Trail (~3h)
 The bridge trail leads from the St. Gallen-Haggen Station over eighteen different bridges.
- Panoramic Walk (Panoramaweg)(~1h)
 An unmissable one is the scenic path leading up to the three ponds. On a clear day, you can see Lake Constance and even Germany on the other side!



Broderbrunnen

The Lake Constance water started to flow into the households of St. Gallen on the 1st of May 1895. As a reminder of this achievement, August Bösch created this fountain. Look over to the roof of the UBS and you'll see the statues Helvetia and Liberta. These two women are also on our Swiss coins. St. Leonhard Str.

Karlstor

Built in 1570, Karlstor is the only remaining gate of the original seven gates in the town wall. It is named after Cardinal Karl Borromäus of Milan, who is supposed to be the first person who went through the gate.

Mühleggbahn

Since 1893, this small cable car connects the old town with the St. Georgen district. The Mühleggbahn leaves every few minutes. You have to ride at least once, but you can also walk through the romantic «Mülenenschlucht» gorge and watch the Steinach waterfalls.

The Dominican Convent of St.Catherine was founded in 1228 as a women's community. The nuns loyal to the Catholic faith moved to Wil in 1607. From then on, it served as a school and also housed the Library built by Vadian. Now it's a children's and youth library. Kathgrinengasse Il

Kirchhoferhaus

In the entrance of this house from 1876, there is a high entrance hall with a great white lion statue, which is worth to see. Museumstr. 27

Narrowest Alley

The «Schmittengässlein» is the 4th narrowest alley in Switzerland. It is a mere 1.21 meter wide. Snuggle through it to find more of the old town on the other side. Schmittengässlein

Tröckneturm Schönenwegen

The tower was built in 1828 and was used to hang up freshly coloured cloth panels for drying.

Library FHS St. Gallen

If you thought that all libraries were the same, then you haven't seen the library designed by the architects Giuliani Hönger.
